Call to Order

Goal Update – Fiona Glade

Fiona spoke with Guillermo and some of the collegewide chairs. Looking to be sure that there is a common understanding. Guillermo is working to develop a series of one pagers to explain some of the more common processes – for faculty and students. Limited staffing makes it a challenge for students looking for in person support. Suggested using some Zoom office hours. Clarified how exams are returned to professors.

New Business - Fiona Glade

For our classes that dual enrollment or early college - they are high school students. So, we have to work with MCPS as well. Those that teach these courses need to have fingerprinting and background investigation completed before teaching the course. This fingerprinting needed to be updated as certain intervals of time. Sometimes, this becomes a problem if a course is added late. Sometimes, these details get missed within other e-mails. Chairs can be cc'ed on the e-mails sent to instructors to assist the process/requirements to be met in time. Some chairs may not like the extra e-mails in their box. Milton suggested bringing this up to the chair's group for their consideration. Shakenna suggested that maybe this is on a regular cycle for all of those that might teach these courses. Fiona suggested a banner or pop-up in Workday. Shelly said the process was not challenging and suggested that there are often 16year-olds in many classes. Alex said that all of his instructors (WDCE) – even though they don't teach students under 18, are fingerprinted because the courses are taught in public schools. Shakenna wondered about the cost as a factor. Fiona offered maybe these are good questions for Kristen. Invite her to the next meeting? Alex offered if the process was more automated but currently HR seems to be overwhelmed keeping track of the process. Stacey has observed an increasing number of minor students... An outside vendor is used to process the background check/fingerprints. We will invite Kristen Roe to our next meeting.
