• Strategic enrollment management (SEM) is an organized concept and process that helps institutions fulfill both their mission and their students' educational goals (Bontrager, 2009; Kerlin, 2008).


• SEM employs comprehensive and systemic activities (Hossler, 2011) to help align institutional resources, departments, and actions to help achieve and maintain enrollment goals.

• SEM is not a quick fix, an enhanced recruitment plan, or a stand-alone activity. SEM requires change and project management principles, strategic planning concepts, broad college-wide participation, and most of all, support and continual engagement of the president and his cabinet to establish and sustain a SEM culture.

- b. How can we enhance education efforts for healthy practices at the College, namely, being vaccinated and boosted, disinfecting your hands, staying home if you are sick, respecting others' decisions to wear or not wear a mask, etc.?
- c. What is the perspective of College Council members about transitioning to vaccination optional for new employees?

Council members will email answers to Shakenna to compile and present the next College Council meeting.

The Council decided to focus on Priority 1. Several members shared the difficulties students have navigating our course listing and getting registered for their courses. This can lead to late registration and other registration errors which can impact a student's

financial aid. While instructional videos and handouts are available to students, it is not enough to solve this problem. Students are still needing help from faculty and staff for registration. This takes away the time to discuss other important questions such as discussing their financial aid status, their program of study, their major, the classes they should take, whether they are part-time or full-time, etc. From this discussion the following two goals were formed:
