Call to Order

Approval of Agenda/Minutes

Constituent Concerns

- Sharon Anthony brought forth a concern from faculty about students not purchasing textbooks due to financial issues.
 - o Are there resources available?
 - Scan textbooks and contact library liaisons to be posted on BlackBoard
 - Librarians informed professors about textbooks that are available as e-books at the beginning of the semester.
 - CARES Act funds
 - MC Foundation
- Mais Alraee brought forth a faculty concern about camera use. Is there a policy for testing? One policy for everyone? Honor system?
 - o Provost Margaret Latimer stated that Mike Mills is working with faculty about the issue.
 - Considering the use of assessments that don't require camera
 - Some students may not have camera
 - Can provide site for students to sign honor code statement
 - Inform students about the importance of honor code and integrity
 - Will follow up

Montgomery College Foundation – Joyce Matthews and Donna Pina

- Foundation always had emergency fund, but the need for emergency funds increased and this year the amount of funds available also increased.
 - MC was one of the first colleges to make decision to cancel commencement and use that money as emergency funding.
 - Reallocation from two unions (Professional Development funds) money to help students
- Help with technology, rent, food, and security
- Ways to help
 - Donate to <u>Students Emergency Assistance Funds</u>
 - o Help students with application
 - If students are eligible for <u>FASFA</u>, fill out FASFA form.
 - Turn in required documents
 - Also apply for <u>CARES</u>
 - Students must have an advocate support statement
 - Can be anybody such as professors and counselors
- Question Are there any resources for students not purchasing textbooks due to money issues?
 - Also fund textbooks and most resources students need to be successful
 - Personalized process
- Question Is it a one-time reward?
 - Yes, it's generally a one-time assistance but there are exceptions.
 - Hope that students will look at resources and plan for the future
 - Help connect with community resources
- Question Can we give language to faculty to let students know that faculty members are advocates and they can connect students to direct help and available resources?
 - O Department Chairs will be happy to be advocates for students.
 - Can also refer students to Counseling and Advising
