**Virtual Campus Update** (Dr. Shinta Hernandez, Dean of the Virtual Campus) – Provided a presentation that informed us of the background, foundation, and next steps for the virtual campus.

- Enrollment in distance learning courses is increasing (asynchronous)
- 4 Pillars of Virtual Campus
  - Innovation academic course quality and modality (Quality Matters recognized)
  - Access, Equity and Inclusion OERs, 7-week accelerated, virtual middle college, wdce
  - Collaboration external (national, state, local) and internal (academic affairs, student affairs, communications, equity & inclusion, virtual campus team)
  - Holistic Educational Excellence Professional Development for faculty and staff; wraparound services for students
- Cross functional teams
  - o Implementation Team (short-term); 8 subcommittees, 26 members
  - o Horizon Team (long-term); 8 subcommittees, 27 members
- Branding and Marketing reworking the website; working on name and rollout
- Microcredentialing for quality assurance. MC's version of quality matters. For online teaching.

# Provost's Report (Margaret Latimer)

The provost provided the following information and updates:

## Student Thoughts (Avisa Tonekaboni)

- Introduction: Avisa Tonekaboni early college student studying biological sciences. She was a
  part of MCLeads last semester. This semester the EIFFEL program. Also involved in pre-med
  society, a student-led club.
- Positive Experience: Live in Rockville but take the shuttle every day to Germantown b/c programming not available in Rockville – solved her transportation problem.
- Challenging Experience: She had trouble adjusting to College but didn't think that was the College's fault – just something she had to adjust to. Writing Center was really helpful to me because English classes were very different.
- She has been fully in-person, this is her first semester. Was online for psychology in the winter because that was how her program was set up.
- Suggestions for MC: Pop up events are excellent. Get to go to these, meet new people, and interact and learn things. Fun experience. Would like to have a few more of those.
- Question: Have you used the library or its serves? Just had an appointment with the librarian this morning. I was struggling with paper so got some help. ATPA coach recommended I check in with a librarian. Got a lot of good information from that time – really clear – and now I know what to work on for my paper. Also scheduled to meet with someone in the writing center.
- Question: Any coaches/embedded support? Yes. Very helpful to have another person to talk with. Appreciate the learning center too. Coaches are just there to help you. Having that has positively impacted me. Talk to my cohort about these resources and experiences. Most students don't know or haven't tried these resources so she's going to get them to join because they are a big help.
- Question: What are your plans after MC? Go to UMD, they accept a lot of credits from Early College program. Hope to be a dentist or work in the dental field.
