 - o MC Alert is important for faculty, staff, and students to sign up for MC alerts.
 - LED message boards in classrooms have been updated. They are now shut off. Will only turn on once there is an emergency.
 - Extended the desktop notification for all smart stations inside classroom. Notification will take over the computer during emergency in classroom.

- Fire Alarm Systems are being updated in buildings so that announcement can be distributed through the speaker system during emergency.
- Active Online Shooter training is coming soon in MC Learns.
- Public Safety Call Center/Central Dispatch
 - new number, 33-33, that would connect caller to a support representative and the person would be able to connect caller to the right campus Public Safety office.
 - Operation hours are from 7:00 22:00.
- Coronavirus/Flu: reminder for staff, faculty, and students to always wash hands. Posters will be posted in buildings.
- RV Council Campus Assistance
 - Get the words out to constituents about Active Shooter Drill
 - Campus Support Team rollout: council can help spread the words and help find volunteers for CST.
 - Chair Christine will update Council's goal to reflect support for Public Safety.
