## Q & A with Dr. Williams

**Q**: What are things that the school should do better?

A: Dr. Williams believes that he is currently not in the position to answer that question because his main priority now is to take everything in during his transition and listen. In doing this, he can later identify this while also amplifying and elevating the positives of the school

**Q**: Are there special groups or activities for students with disabilities?

A: Montgomery college has a wonderful disability support services area on every campus so that's certainly a place where they can start. If a student is interested in joining or club or creating a club that accommodates their needs, they can also reach out to Student Life who would be more than happy to help.

 $\underline{\mathbf{Q}}$ : What made you come to Montgomery County and become President of Montgomery College?

A: Driving desire was the college's focus on being a student-focused institute and providing opportunities that students need based on the context that students are arriving at the college. Faculty and staff are heavily dedicated and engaging with students which was another huge factor. Not to mention the college's unwavering commitment to addressing social inequities and racial injustices to

continue to become an anti-racist institution. Workforce development and innovations taking place at the college.

**Q**: What does one day in your life look like and is it possible to have a contest where students can shadow?

A: It's a very dedicated, diligent, enthusiastic day filled with care, compassion, and learning while trying to make decisions that represent inclusion and best support the college's goal of being equitable.
