Program Stop the Bleed- provides public access kits- control bleeding to save lives. American
College of American College of Surgeons initiated this program; it centers around military
medicine. FEMA provided grant money – moved programs into public spaces. Boxes will be
located near LEDs. The Public Safety Office has been trained; the training is a part of the First Aid
curriculum. Stop the Bleed Program has web-based training; employees can get certified
through First-Aid. Employees at the College are certified to teach. Adam can connect with
resources. Off-site facilities? Do not yet have the kits. One will be installed at GBTC.

## Linda Griffin and Byron Jamison – WDCE Operations, Lumens Team

- CC-10s deadline for this year, 4/30. Comply with guidelines. Contract Training need to know the company id; CC-10 on comment line specify the company name; MHEC requirement; Send a reminder for classes for renewal? Linda might send a report before Friday.
- Byron: Lumens Youth Program pilot was successful second cycle of registering students through Lumens; difficult to reconcile when there are errors.
- Lumens 900 active students. \$500,000 revenue generated; can generate more.
- Database down to a handful of errors. Corrected discount labels and amounts. Need to work
  on: database does not capture contact hours; pay attention to number of contact hours; outof-state fee tuition plus OOS; biggest problem operation production schedule proofing –
  check against what is in Banner; need consistency between schedule pdf and Lumens. For
  classes that repeat every term, can build for each semester as soon as possible.
