

BOARD OF TRUSTEES ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES



Purpose of Trustee Information Day

To fulfill its governance role, the Board of Trustees makes policy decisions that impact the life of the college and support student success. Trustee Information Day is an intentional occasion to *build a competent board, monitor and strengthen programs,* and *ensure effective planning* by:

- 1. Connecting and communicating with campus-based constituents
- 2. Observing, experiencing, and understanding the impact and implications of Board decisions on constituents and the campus, including campus assets, acquisitions, and accomplishments
- 3. Engaging in focused strategic conversations
- 4. Informing and envisioning opportunities, challenges, and impacts of future decisions
- 5. Seeking and identifying common interests and concerns for establishing strategic goals and objectives



Traditional Trustee Information Day

- 1. Focus on Campus and individual students
- 2. Connect and communicate with Campus-based leaders, employees, students
- 3. Observe, experience, and understand the impact and implications of Board decisions on the campus assets, acquisitions, and accomplishments
- 4. Engage in campus focused strategic conversations
- 5. Inform and envision opportunities, challenges, and impacts of future decisions that might specifically affect the campus
- 6. Identify common interests and concerns for establishing strategic goals and objectives to advance the campus



Contemporary Trustee Information Day

- 1. Focus on Students and individual students
- 2. Connect and communicate with students
- 3. Observe experience, and understand the impact and implications of Board decisions on the academic and non-academic experiences of students
- 4. Engage in student focused strategic conversations
- 5. Inform and envision opportunities, challenges, and impacts of future decisions that might specifically affect students and student success
- 6. Identify common interests and concerns for establishing strategic goals and objectives to advance student success

Trustee Information Day Lessons Learned

- 1. Opportunities to consider Policy Impacts
- 2. Opportunities to consider Policy Implications
- 3. Authentic engagement with students as a stakeholders (e.g. listening, experiencing, learning, questioning, understanding)
- 4. Authentic engagement with all stakeholders in post event debrief



Trustee Information Day Logistics

- 1. Advance planning to include:
 - Communication
 - Cooperation
 - Collaboration
 - Coordination
- 2. Develop process for identifying and selecting students
- 3. Identify a course schedule and best course experience for the day that represents the common student experience (e.g., lab vs lecture vs exam; length of class session; class session time of day)



Trustee Information Day Logistics

- 4. Develop process for best pairing trustees and students (e.g., based upon some common interest)
- 5. Identifying and engaging all stakeholders at the beginning of planning process and throughout implementation process
- 6. Engaging all stakeholders in post event debrief
- 7. Develop Communication Plan with campus Provost, Dean, Chair, Faculty, Student and other assets about the pre- and post-trustee/student shadowing experience (e.g. trustee profile, student profile, information about course session and faculty, trustee liaison, student liaison, campus liaison)
