Citizenship and Integration Grant Awarded

The College's <u>Citizenship Preparation Program</u> has been awarded another two-year \$450,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to support free English language classes, citizenship

instruction, and naturalization legal services for immigrants. The program delivers services to beginning and intermediate English language learners from countries including Afghanistan, China, El Salvador, Ethiopia, Honduras, Iran, Peru, Russia, and Ukraine. The funding will support 500 students in language instruction and screening for naturalization eligibility. In addition, 240 participants are anticipated to have their naturalization paperwork prepared and submitted by the grant sub-awardee, Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C. Congratulations to the faculty and staff whose efforts nourish this valuable program for new Americans and to Dr. Donna Kinerney, dean, adult ESOL & basic skills for college and careers, who is the project director.
