Subject: Election Season Reminder—Guidelines for Political Campaign Activities

Today marks nine weeks before Maryland's primary election day (Tuesday, June 23, 2026); early voting will be available from Thursday, June 11, 2026 through Thursday, June 18, 2026 (including Saturday and Sunday). Wherever you live, all eligible voters in the Montgomery College community are encouraged to register and exercise their right to vote in the upcoming elections.

Each employee and student has a right to expression with regard to candidates and issues. We are fortunate to live in a country where these rights are cherished and protected. However, as a tax-exempt, public institution of higher education, the College itself is prohibited from directly or indirectly participating in any political campaign on behalf of or against any political party or candidate for public office. Therefore, employees and representatives of the College community may not imply that the College supports or opposes any party or candidate.

In addition, College resources—including employee time, computers, printed material, webpages, and rooms, among other resources—cannot be used by an employee to advance a candidate, party, or political issue. In-person and virtual College-sponsored events generally should be structured so that all eligible candidates or representatives on all sides have an opportunity to be heard. Please note that our student organizations are not bound by the same obligations and can organize informational events according to their interests.

Employees are encouraged to review the College's [Political Activity Policy \(31004\)](#). In addition, the American Council on Education published an issue brief, "[Student Voting and College Political Campaign-Related Activities in 2024](#)," regarding student voting and political activity, which offers illustrative examples of permissive and prohibited political campaign activities on campus.
